



Good afternoon Dennis,

THRHA received your request for information on thee Phase IV units built in Hoonah. I have reviewed all the documents provided by the City of Hoonah and have researched our own files.

There are many communications regarding this project referring to either New Mutual Help or Low Rent units including letters of support for THRHA's grant applications. HUD did not approve THRHA's application for New Mutual Help units but did approve the Low Rent application. According to the Quit Claim Deed executed on May 6, 1996 (attached) for Phase IV, the land was given for the construction of 20 Mutual Help units and/or 20 low rent units. The Deed was most likely worded to allow either or both in case both applications were not awarded, which was the case. Phase IV contains 20 low rent units and therefore fulfills the requirements of the Quit Claim Deed.

QUITCLAIM DEED

The Grantor, CITY OF HOONAH, P. O. Box 360, Hoonah, Alaska 99829, a municipal Corporation, for and in consideration of one dollar (\$1.00), in hand paid, CONVEYS to the TLINGET-HAIDA REGIONAL HOUSING AUTHORITY, P. O., Box 32237, Juneau, Alaska 99803, a public corporation organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Alaska, the following described real estate, to wit:

That portion of land within described Sections located within Township 43 South, Range 61 East, Copper River Meridian, Sitka Recording District, First Judicial District, State of Alaska, and known as the Hoonah Mutual Help/Low Rent Housing Development-Phase IV.

Section 27, SW 1/4 SW 1/4; except U. S. Surveys 2097, 2124, 2128, 2414 and 4539;

Section 28, SE 1/4 SE 1/4; except U. S. Surveys 736, 751, 1735, 1929, 2097, 2128, 2577, 3716, 3717 and 4539;

all situated in the State of Alaska.

Grantor, for itself, it's successors and assigns, hereby convenants and agrees with Grantee that should Grantee within eighteen (18) months from the date hereto, fail to enter into a contract award for the construction of twenty (20) units of Mutual Help Housing and/or twenty (20) units of Low Rent Housing, of which the housing units are to be constructed on the above real property, then such real property shall revert to Grantor; provided that not more than sixty (60) nor less than thirty (30) days prior to the end of said eighteen (18) month period, Grantor shall give written notice to the Grantee at it's address in Juneau, Alaska, of Grantor's intention to exercise said reverter. Failure to give such notice during said time period, time being of the essence shall constitute a waiver of Grantor's reversionary interest and Grantee's title shall become indeafeasible.

Such reverter shall occur automatically and without the necessity of further action, provided that due notice has occurred and Grantor shall have the right to re-enter the above real property. To clear any cloud on Grantor's title in the event of and by such reverter, Grantee agrees to CONVEY any interest remaining in the real property to Grantor at the end of eighteen (18) month period.

CITY OF HOONAH

ORDINANCE # 23-06-01

An ordinance of the City of Hoonah revising Title 1 of the Hoonah Municipal Code, including amending, repealing, and readopting various chapters, sections, and subsections of Title 1, and authorizing the print of the revised Title 1 of the Hoonah Municipal Code, in accordance with AS 29.25.050(b).

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HOONAH, ALASKA

Section 1. <u>Classification</u>. This ordinance is of a general and permanent nature, the titles, chapters and sections hereby amended shall be added to the Hoonah Municipal Code.

Section 2. Severability. If any provision of this ordinance or any application thereof to any person or circumstances is held to be invalid, the remainder of this ordinance and the application to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected thereby.

Section 3. Enactment. Title 1 of the Hoonah City Code is amended by adding a new chapter to read as follows:

Code Adoption

1.01.010 Adoption and code name.

1.01.070

The ordinances in the following chapters and sections shall be called the "Code of Ordinances, City of Hoonah, Alaska" or "Hoonah City Code," and may be so cited. Ordinances shall be cited by giving the title, chapter and section numbers preceded by the code.

1.01.015 Prior ordinances superseded.

This code supersedes all ordinances adopted prior to this code and not included within

this code at the time of this code's adoption.

1.01.020 Title, chapter and section headings.

This code is organized into titles, chapters, sections, subsections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses

and phrases and reference may be had to the titles, chapters, sections,

subsections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses and phrases of the Hoonah City Code and such

references shall apply to that numbered title, chapter, section or subsection, paragraphs, sentence,

clause and phrase as it appears in the code.

1.01.025 Definitions.

The following definitions apply to this code and all city ordinances unless the plain meaning

requires otherwise:

City: The City of Hoonah, Alaska, or the area within the territorial limits of the City of Hoonah,

Alaska.

Clerk: The city clerk.

Code: The Code of Ordinances, City of Hoonah, Alaska; Hoonah City Code.

Council: The City Council of City of Hoonah, Alaska.

Persons: A corporation, company, partnership, firm, association, organization, business, trust, or

society, as well as a natural person.

Publish: To post a notice within the city in three locations open to the public, one of which shall

be the city offices, for a period of not less than five days.

State: The State of Alaska.

Voter: A United States citizen who is qualified to vote in state elections, has been a resident of the City of Hoonah for 30 days immediately preceding the election, is registered to vote in state elections, and is not disqualified under Article V of the constitution of the State of Alaska.

1.01.030 Grammatical interpretation.

The following grammatical rules shall apply in the city of Hoonah code of ordinances:

Gender. Any gender includes the other gender.

Singular and plural. The singular number includes the plural, and the plural includes the singular.

Tenses. Words used in the present tense include the past and the future tenses and vice

versa, unless manifestly inapplicable. All words and phrases shall be construed and understood

according to the context and the commonly approved usage of the language, but technical words

and phrases and such others as may have acquired a peculiar and appropriate meaning in the law

shall be construed and understood according to such peculiar and appropriate meaning.

"May" is permissive.

"Must" and "Shall", each is mandatory.

1.01.035 Effect of repeal of ordinances.

Ordinances repealed remain in force for the trial and punishment of all past violations of them, and for the recovery of penalties and forfeitures already incurred, and for the preservation of all rights and remedies existing by them and so far as they apply, to any office, trust, proceeding, right, contract, or event already affected by them.

1.01.040 Amendment; addition and repeal.

A. All ordinances passed subsequent to this code which amend, repeal or in any way affect this code, may be numbered in accordance with the numbering system of this code and printed for inclusion herein. In the case of repealed chapters, sections and subsections of any part thereof, by subsequent ordinances, such repealed portions may be excluded from the code by omission from reprinted pages affected thereby. The subsequent ordinances as numbered and printed or omitted, in the case of repeal, shall be prima facie evidence of such subsequent ordinances until such time that this code and subsequent ordinances numbered or omitted are readopted as a new code by the city council.

- B. Amendments to any other provisions of this code shall be made by amending such provisions by specific reference to the section number of this code in the following language: "This section of the Hoonah city code is hereby amended to read as follows:" The new provisions shall then be set out in full as desired.
- C. In the event a new section not heretofore existing in the code is to be added, the following language shall be used: "That the Hoonah city code is hereby amended by adding a section, to be numbered, which said section reads as follows:" The new section shall then be set out in full as desired.
- D. All sections, chapters or provisions desired to be repealed must be specifically repealed by section or chapter number.

1.01.045 Severability of ordinances and parts of code.

The sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses and phrases of this code are severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, or section of this code is declared unconstitutional by the valid judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality shall

not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, and sections of this code.

Section 4. Enactment. Title 1 of the Hoonah City Code is amended by adding a new chapter to read as follows:

Chapter 1.05

City Information

Sections:

1.05.010 Name of city and form of government
1.05.020 City boundaries and history
1.05.030 City seal; use of city seal

1.05.010 Name of city and form of government.

A. The City of Hoonah is a first-class city, incorporated in 1946, a municipal corporation and a political subdivision of the State of Alaska, incorporated under the name: "City of Hoonah, Alaska". B. The form of government of the city of Hoonah is the council-mayor form of government.

1.05.020 City boundaries and history.

The boundaries of the city are:

Beginning at the protracted northeast corner of Section 22, T43S, R61E, Copper River Meridian (CRM);

thence, south to the protracted southeast corner of the northeast one-quarter of the northeast one-quarter of Section 27, T43S, R61E, CRM;

- thence, east to the protracted northeast corner of the southeast one-quarter of the northeast one-quarter of Section 26, T43S, R61E, CRM;
- thence; south to the-protracted-southeast corner -of Section 35, T43S, R61E, CRM;
- thence, west to a point within Port Frederick where the protracted southwest corner of the southeast one-quarter of the southwest one-quarter of Section 32, T43S, R61E, CRM; would be;
- thence, north to a point within Port Frederick where the protracted northwest corner of the northeast one-quarter of the northwest one-quarter of Section 32, T43S, R61E, CRM; would be;
- thence, east to a point within Port Frederick where the protracted northeast corner of Section 32, T43S, R61E, CRM would be;
- thence, north to the intersection with the boundary of Alaska Tidelands Survey No. 29, approved by the Director of the Alaska Division of Lands on June 25,1964 (hereinafter ATS No. 29); thence, N 34" W to Corner No. 4 of ATS No. 29;
- thence, N 51' E to the line of mean-low water;
- thence, meandering along the line of mean-low water generally in a northerly and easterly direction to the intersection with extension of the protracted northern boundary of Section 21, T43S, R61E, CRM;
- thence, east to the protracted northeast corner of Section 22, T43S, R61E, CRM; the point of beginning;
- Containing 8.75 square miles, more or less, all in the Sitka Recording District, First Judicial District, State of Alaska.
- 1.05.030 City seal; use of city seal.

A. The city shall have a seal bearing the words "City of Hoonah, Est. 1946, Alaska".

B. The city seal shall be used to authenticate acts of the city. The seal shall be kept by the clerk and shall be affixed to all acts or documents that are required to be authenticated.

Section 5. Enactment. Section 1.12.020 is hereby amended to read as follows:

(Words in **boldface** and <u>underlined</u> indicate language being added; words [CAPITALIZED, BRACKETED, STRIKETHROUGH] indicate language being deleted.)

Public records may be inspected at the city office [WHERE THE RECORDS ARE KEPT] during the regular office hours. [OF THAT PARTICULAR OFFICE.] All city officers and employees shall, [CONSISTENT WITH THE ORDERLY CONDUCT OF CITY BUSINESS,] make a good faith and diligent effort to respond to requests for inspection of records made pursuant to this code. If one or more requests by a single requestor or agent of a requestor within a calendar month are anticipated to require more than one [PERSON-] hour to complete, the city may require the requestor to pay costs for the period in excess of one hour. [THE COSTS MAY NOT EXCEED THE UNIT COST OF SALARY AND BENEFITS FOR EMPLOYEES WHO ARE INVOLVED IN THE SEARCH.] Except in the case of news organizations, authorized search costs must be paid before the records are searched.

Section 6. Enactment. Subsection C of section 1.12.030 is amended to read as follows:

C. Charge for Copies. The charge for copies [(WHETHER CERTIFIED OR NOT)] may not exceed the cost to the city, which cost may include photocopying, clerical and other directly

related costs. [DIRECTLY RELATED TO THE PROVISIONS OF THE COPIES.] Payment for copies must be received before making the copies, except in the case of a request for an employee or agent of a news organization. The city clerk is authorized to establish rates and charges for copies of public records[, BOTH CERTIFIED AND PHOTOGRAPHIC] and for clerical time as set forth in Section 1.12.020 and in subsections A and B of this section. The city clerk may, in his or her discretion, waive charges for incidental copies.

Nothing in this code shall require the city to create records, compile, summarize, outline or in other ways create information from existing public records. In those instances where the city official who is the custodian of the record determines that the city has the requisite resources to compile or create records to comply with a request for information, the city may charge the requestor with the costs of such compilation or summary. [, WHICH COSTS SHALL INCLUDE THE SALARY AND BENEFITS AND OVERHEAD CHARGES FOR THE CITY

Section 8. Enactment. Section 1.12.050 is amended to read as follows:

The following records and information are exempt from disclosure:

[THIS CODE ARTICLE SHALL NOT BE CONSISTENT TO REQUIRE DISCLOSURE OF THE FOLLOWING RECORDS OR INFORMATION

Section 9. Enactment. Section 1.12.060 is amended to read as follows:

Any denial of a request for information or inspection of the city record shall be appealable to the city council upon written notice filed with the city administrator/mayor within five days of the city clerk's decision. [IN THE EVENT AN INDIVIDUAL REQUESTS INFORMATION AND IS REFUSED, THE INDIVIDUAL SHALL BE NOTIFIED IN WRITING WITHIN FIVE WORKING DAYS OF HIS RIGHT TO APPEAL THE DECISION TO THE CITY MANAGER IF NOT SATISFIED WITH THE RULING OF THE CITY MANAGER THE INDIVIDUAL SHALL BE NOTIFIED WITHIN FIVE WORKING DAYS OF THAT DECISION OF HIS RIGHT TO APPEAL TO THE CITY COUNCIL AT ITS NEXT REGULARLY SCHEDULED MEETING, WHICH SHALL BE THE FINAL AND BINDING AUTHORITY.]

Section 10. Enactment. Subsection A of Section 1.16.010 is amended to read as follows:

A. Any person failing to abide by any provisions of this code or failing to comply with any of the mandatory requirements of any [THE] ordinance, rule or regulation adopted or issued in accordance with this code, [IS GUILTY OF A VIOLATION] commits a minor offense as that term is defined in the Alaska Rules of Minor Offense Procedure.

Section 11. Enactment. Subsection A of section 1.16.020 is amended to read: (A) In addition to any fine or other penalty prescribed by law, a defendant who pleads guilty or <u>no</u> contest [NOLO CONTENDERE] to, forfeits bail for, or is convicted of a violation of a municipal ordinance imposing a penalty authorized by AS 29.25.070(a), shall be assessed a

surcharge of ten dollars (\$10.00) if the fine or bail forfeiture amount for the offense is thirty dollars (\$30.00) or more, or as established under AS 12.55.039.

Section 12. Enactment. Subsection B of section 1.16.020 is amended to read: The surcharge shall be deposited into the **State** [STATE] of Alaska general fund as directed by AS 29.25.074.

Section 13. Enactment. Subsection B of section 1.16.030 is amended to read as follows: The city **administrator** [MANAGER] is authorized to commence suit or exercise any other legal remedy to collect any delinquent fee, fine, charge or assessments.

Section 14. Enactment. Chapter 1.16 is amended by adding new section to read as follows:

1.16.040 **Procedure.**

A. The charge for the violation of a code provision may be brought by a city-designated code enforcement officer, the mayor, or that city official responsible for the administration and enforcement of the code provision which has been violated.

B. The city shall use the Alaska Uniform Citation form to provide notice of a minor offense to anyone accused of violating any provisions of this code, or any ordinance, rule or regulation adopted or issued in accordance with this code.

Section 15. Enactment. Chapter 1.16 is amended by adding a new section to read as follows:

1.16.050 Disposition of minor offenses.

A. Any person charged with a minor offense listed on a fine schedule may dispose of the minor offense by paying the fine set for the violation charged and pleading "no contest" in person or by mail.

B. Any person charged with a minor offense listed on the fine schedule may appear in court to contest the charge. As a minor offense, trial is by the court without a jury, and there is no right to court-appointed defense counsel.

Section 16. Enactment. Chapter 1.16 is amended by adding a new section to read as follows:

1.16.060 Minor offense fine schedule.

In accordance with AS 29.25.070(a), citations for the following offenses may be disposed of as provided in AS 12.25.195 through 12.25.230, without a court appearance, upon payment of the fine amounts listed in the fine schedule below, plus the state surcharge required by AS 12.55.039. Fines must be paid to the court. The Alaska court system's Rules of Minor Offense Procedures apply to all offenses listed in the fine schedule listed below. If a person charged with one of these offenses appears in court and is found to have committed the offense, the court shall impose the penalty set forth in the fine schedule below for that offense. The penalty imposed for any offense may not exceed the fines set forth in the fine schedule below as follows:

Code Section	Description of Offense	Fine

Section 17. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective upon adoption.
